



U.S. - South Asia Mayoral Platform On Sustainable Cities

October 21 - 22, 2024 | Jaipur, India

Background

Over the past 20 years, South Asia's energy consumption has surged by more than 50%. Driven by urbanization in the region, electricity demand in countries such as Bangladesh, Bhutan, India, Nepal, and Sri Lanka has been increasing by over 5% annually over the past two decades, with projections suggesting a potential doubling by 2050. As cities grow, energy consumption in sectors like buildings, transportation, and industry is rising, contributing to increased greenhouse gas (GHG) emissions. There is a significant opportunity and necessity for cities in the region to raise their ambitions and implement strategies and actions for a sustainable energy transition (SET). City governments will play a crucial role in such a transition, to manage urban energy demand sustainably, accelerate cities' progress towards net zero goals and ultimately contribute to the achievement of national climate and energy targets.

A framework for cooperation between South Asian and U.S. cities, is being envisaged spearheaded by USAID's South Asia Regional Energy Partnership (SAREP) program. The <u>SAREP program</u> aims to improve access to affordable, secure, reliable, and sustainable energy in six countries – Bangladesh, Bhutan, India, Maldives, Nepal, and Sri Lanka – to strengthen systems and processes, in line with the economic and energy-security priorities of these countries. The said framework will enable a platform for knowledge brokering and exchange of ideas between the city mayors of the United States of America (U.S.) and South Asia (SA), and will be focused on addressing key challenges and successes in developing resilient cities, focusing on the areas of municipal infrastructure. It is foreseen that this platform would catalyse the exchange of innovative approaches and technological advances as well as approaches to economic revitalization within cities.

To initiate the platform and outline the plan for the annual gathering, USAID SAREP, in collaboration with ICLEI South Asia, is organizing a two-day program on the sidelines of the South Asia Clean Energy Forum (SACEF) 2024, focused on exploring opportunities for sustainable energy transitions in cities across the U.S., India, and South Asia. SACEF is the flagship event of USAID India, focusing on clean energy transition in South Asia with an emphasis on action-oriented discourse. SACEF 2024 will bring together key government officials and senior energy experts from the region as well as from across the world.

- To launch U.S. South Asia Mayoral Platform on Sustainable Cities
- To engage in a strategic dialogue to identify key priority areas and explore opportunities for collaboration and knowledge sharing between the cities through the platform





 To facilitate exchange of good practices, innovative approaches and technical solutions for clean and sustainable energy implementation among city leaders and decision makers of U.S. and South Asia
