



The South Asia Regional Energy Hub (SAREH) is a platform for communication and collaboration within the USAID's South Asia Regional Energy Partnership (SAREP) Program to support and promote the United States Agency for International Development (USAID)'s energy sector programs in South Asia (SA), primarily the countries including, Bangladesh, Bhutan, India, Maldives, Nepal, and Sri Lanka.

## Background

In 2018, the United States Government (USG) launched the Asia Enhancing Development and Growth through Energy (Asia EDGE) initiative, now known as Clean EDGE Asia, to support the growth of sustainable and secure energy markets across the Indo-Pacific region. To support the implementation of Clean EDGE Asia in South Asia, a South Asia Regional Energy Hub (SAREH) was established by USAID/India. The regional Hub or SAREH is manged by USAID's regional energy program, South Asia Regional Energy Partnership (SAREP).

## Purpose

As a knowledge service platform, the hub's primary objective is to tell the story of USAID South Asia energy portfolio, fostering a unified regional voice. This common multimedia platform communicates emerging developments, success stories, lessons learned from ongoing bilateral and regional activities, and unique initiatives originating through USAID's work.

Amplify knowledge generated through various USAID energy programs.



Bring together diverse USAID Mission Implementing Partners to share the impact of USAID energy programs.



Identify needs for partner countries that SAREH can assist with.



Demonstrate support for the sustainability goals of partner countries.



Highlight solutions for climate change mitigation.

**Bi-weekly events calendar-** Key events hosted by USAID or IPs are mapped out for SAREH internal and external stakeholders every two weeks.

South Asia Energy Series- Webbased public knowledge sharing event offering insights into energy sector topics of interest.

Collaborating, learning, and adapting (CLA)- Web-based learning sessions for USAID missions and IPs on various energy sector development topics.
